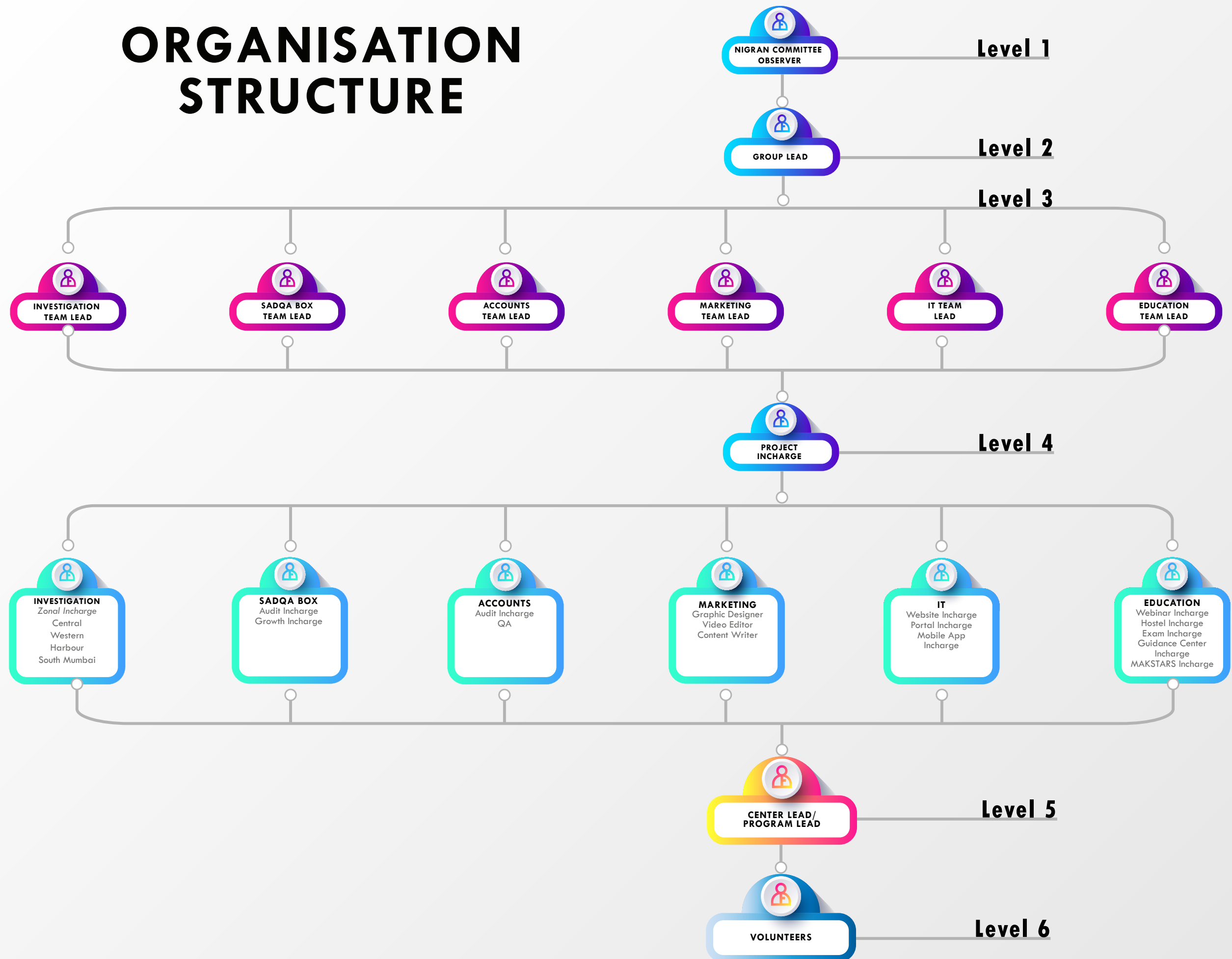

# ORGANISATION STRUCTURE





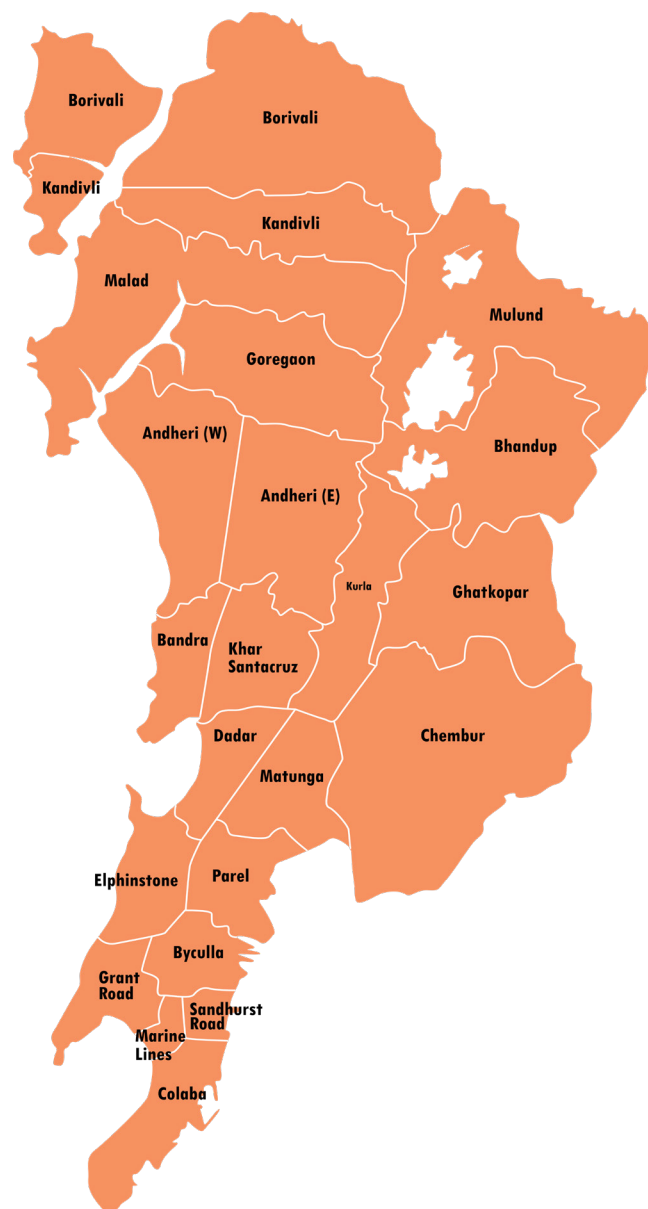
# DEMOGRAPHY OF MUMBAI

**M**umbai, a city of migrants, has long been home to diverse communities, including Shia and Sunni Muslims. Muslim migration to the city began in the 19th century, with wealthy Bohra traders and working-class Julaha Ansari weavers being among the early settlers. By 2011, the city's population had reached over 12 million, with around 2.5 million Muslims, including an estimated 500,000 to 700,000 Shias.

Shias, a minority within Mumbai's Muslim population, are relatively new and continue to establish themselves in the city and its suburbs. They are diverse in regional backgrounds and sectarian orientations, ranging from Twelver Shiites to Ismaeli communities like the Bohras and Khojas. While some, particularly Ismaeli Shiites, hold economic influence, others, such as working-class migrants from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, face socio-economic challenges.

The Twelver Shia community, though devoted to their faith, historically faced challenges in organizing charity work. Religious donations like Zakat, Khums, and Sadqa have often been managed in an unorganized way, leading to short-term aid and dependency rather than long-term upliftment. There is a need for a more efficient system to manage and invest these funds.

Anfaal Foundation, founded in 2017, aims to address these challenges by establishing a transparent and structured approach to religious charities. Rooted in Islamic teachings, the foundation focuses on providing education, healthcare, and support to orphans, widows, and the underprivileged, with a goal of empowering individuals and fostering self-reliance within the community. Through long-term planning, Anfaal Foundation seeks to reduce dependency and create a more prosperous future for all.

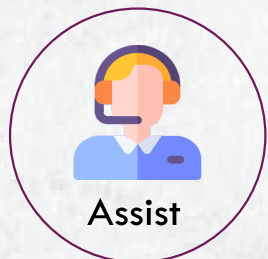

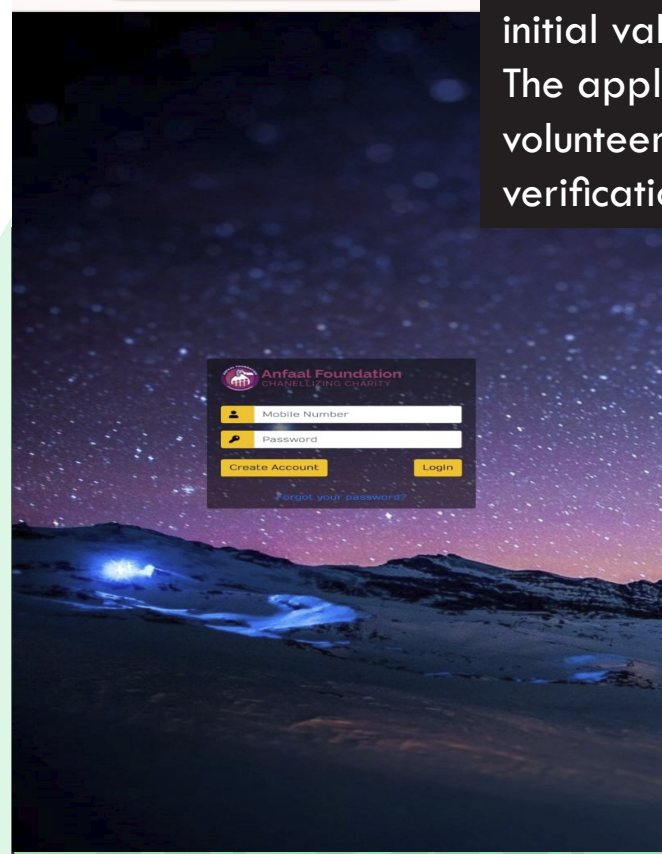


# ANFAAL GOES HI-TECH WITH ONLINE PORTAL

With an online facility for beneficiaries to submit applications, the organization eliminates the need for individuals to physically visit office premises. Through its user-friendly mobile app and web portal, applicants can easily file their requests for support.

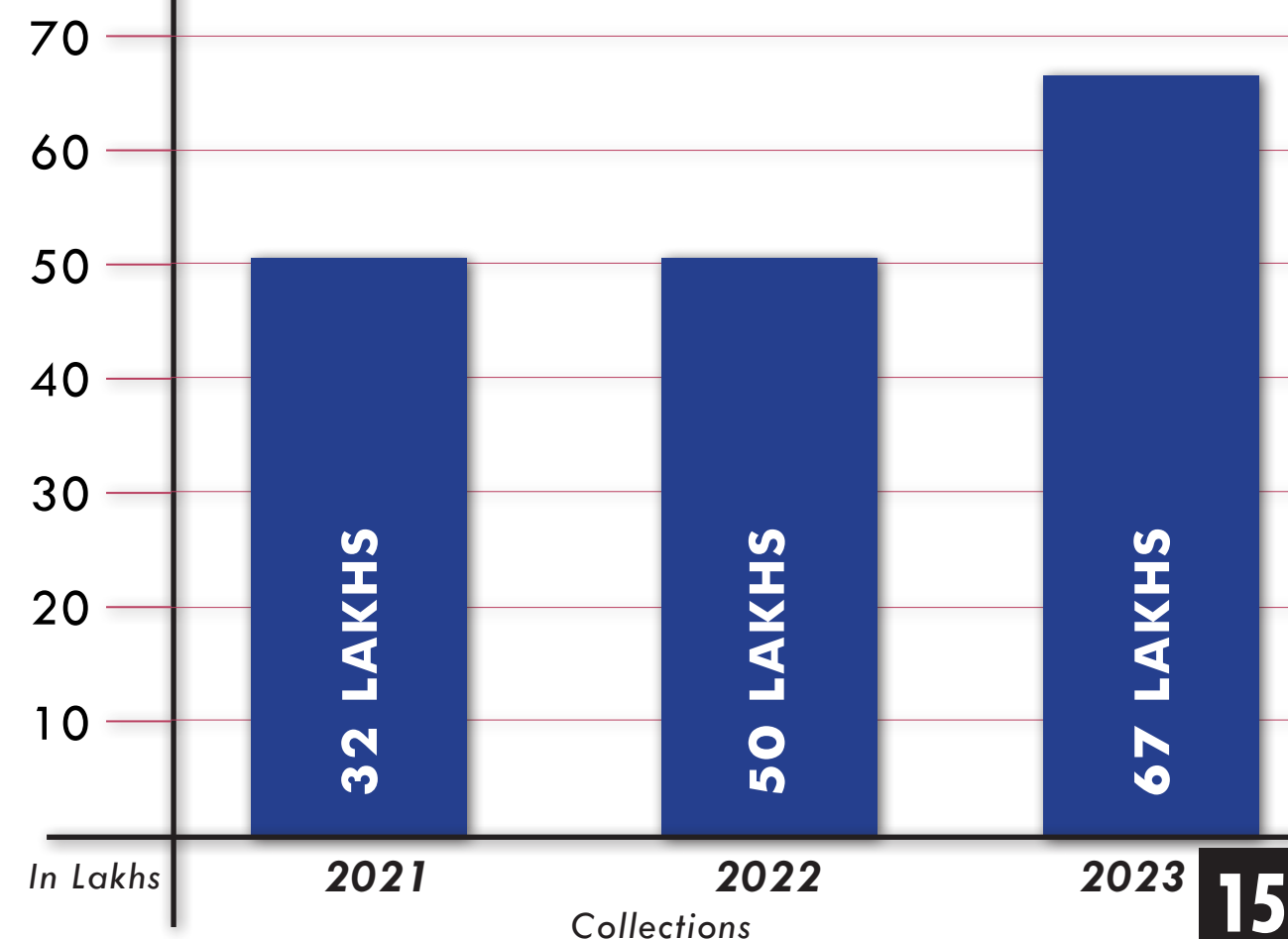
Once an application is submitted, it undergoes a thorough review by an internal investigative committee, which assesses the initial validity and urgency of the request. The application is then forwarded to field volunteers, who perform on-the-ground verification in the applicant's local area.

# HELPING OUT OF THE BOX

Anfaal Foundation was flagged with the free distribution of an innovative designed Sadqa Box among family, friends and close acquaintance who began to save daily sadqa money, and the results were motivating. The concept was then marketed in few clusters of the community through community halls and mosques. Within couple of months the outreach increased to 800 families and by the end of year 2023, over 4000 households in Mumbai were actively saving their charity money in the Sadqa Box. A collection representative visits these houses either once or every two months to collect the funds.

**W**e are thrilled to announce the launch of our dream project, the Anfaal Center of Excellence (ACE), a flagship initiative of the Anfaal Foundation. Established in June 2024 at the Haidery Hallaur Education Center, ACE provides tuition facilities for students in grades 5, 6, 7, and 8. This project, supported by our generous sponsors, is a testament to our long-term vision and commitment to education. It aims to empower beneficiaries by providing them with the knowledge and skills needed to become self-reliant and valuable assets to society. ACE focuses on strengthening the foundational skills of students, particularly in numeracy and literacy. By enhancing their understanding of educational concepts, we pave the way for them to excel in national-level competitive exams in the future. Currently, 170 students are enrolled at ACE, supported by a dedicated staff of three teachers and two administrators. This initiative reflects our gratitude and dedication to the principles of Shia theology, emphasizing the importance of knowledge and community support.

MAKSTARS convenes annually as a prestigious admission examination, welcoming students from across India in search of promising young talent. 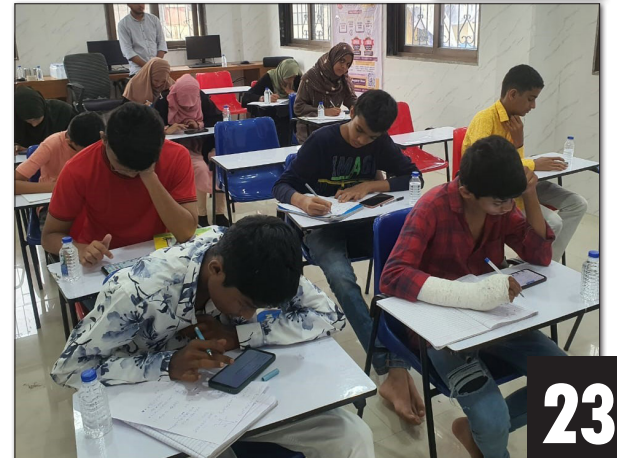

# MAKSTARS: WHERE THERE IS A WILL...

In a small village in Alipour, Karnataka, lived a young boy named Mohammad. A 10th-grade student, Mohammad harboured big dreams despite his humble surroundings. He aspired to become a doctor, a goal born from his desire to help people and make a meaningful difference. However, his dream faced a tough challenge—his father, a tailor, barely earned enough to make ends meet, let alone afford the high fees of medical school. The only way for Mohammad to achieve his goal was through a highly competitive exam called NEET, the gateway to gaining admission into a medical college. It was a daunting task, but Mohammad refused to let his circumstances dictate his future. Determined to pursue his passion, he enrolled in the MAKSTARS program, an initiative designed to help students like him prepare for the demanding NEET exam.

The first stage of the MAKSTARS selection process was held online. Mohammad, driven by his ambition, studied hard and passed the initial screening. He was then invited to the second stage—an online video inter-

view, which tested not just his academic knowledge, but also his perseverance and determination. Despite the pressure, Mohammad shone through once again, successfully clearing the second stage. His hard work paid off when he was granted a spot in a two-year residential program at the MAKSTARS campus in Hyderabad. It was a life-changing moment for Mohammad. Leaving behind his small village, he moved to the bustling city, where he spent the next two years immersed in rigorous preparation for the NEET exam. Far from home, he worked tirelessly, determined to turn his dream into reality. After completing his 12th grade, Mohammad appeared for NEET, a moment that would determine the course of his future. The stakes were high, but so was his resolve. And finally, after years of dedication and hard work, Mohammad cracked the exam and secured a government seat in a medical college. For Mohammad, this was more than just an academic achievement. It was a victory over the barriers of poverty, a step toward a future where he could live a life of dignity.

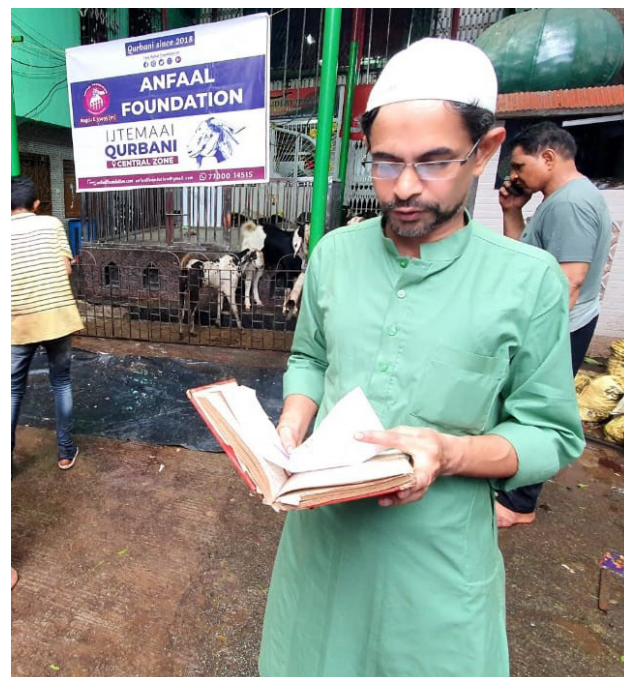




## IJTEMAAI QURBANI
