



OUR JOURNEY AND FUTURE VISION

Achievements — Artisans mainly thrive on daily wages, but almost 22 yrs back we shifted them to monthly salary model. A cluster formation model was implemented in chikankari artisans, who were put on monthly salaries, which strengthened them economically. Best outcome was they were able to send their children to schools. This shift not only provided financial stability but also empowered the artisans to plan for the future with a sense of security. Over time, the community witnessed a remarkable transformation as educational opportunities expanded, leading to a new generation that was equipped with knowledge and skills beyond traditional crafts.

The cluster model fostered a sense of camaraderie and collaboration among the artisans, as they shared resources and ideas to improve their craft. Workshops and training sessions became commonplace, enhancing their techniques and introducing modern innovations while preserving the authenticity of their art.

ISSUES AND BOTTLE NECKS.

The most unorganised sector of hand embroidery is the largest cluster of artisans. But unprofessional ways which have being followed are making it difficult to handle big international orders. Hand embroidery sector is lacking in innovation and design aspect, it needs to match with the latest trends of fast fashion to survive in the rapidly changing fashion industry. Many lakh artisans are in Lucknow and nearby villages, professional centres should be formed and work security guaranteed.

The middle menace needs to be eradicated as it leads to exploitation of workers. Majority of the artisans are underpaid with no incentives or upskilling. They have numerous medical issues due to working in unlit rooms.

Kairree livelihood program, which will provide interventions for sustainable livelihood in crafts sector. The program aims to empower artisans by offering skill development workshops, access to modern tools and technology, and opportunities to connect with broader markets. By fostering collaboration with local and international designers, Kairree will help artisans innovate while preserving traditional techniques. Additionally, the program will focus on promoting fair trade practices, ensuring that craftsmen receive equitable compensation for their work. Through these efforts, Kairree seeks to create a thriving ecosystem where craftspeople can sustain their heritage and improve their quality of life.
