

Established in 2017 in New Delhi, It is a landmark initiative of Welayat Foundation.








Objectives

Mission 2047: Roadmap for Shia Community

- To build a self-reliant, educated, and healthy Shia community by 2047.
- By 2047, we must establish at least 500+ senior secondary schools. Some of this will come through our own efforts, and some with the support of stakeholders.
- In 2047, India will complete 100 years of independence, and it is essential to increase the contribution of the Shia community in nation building.

- We must focus on the **youth**, because the future entirely depends on them.
- Our contribution should be visible in **every field**. If we are **4% of the total population**, then in schools, hospitals, jobs, the army, and other sectors, our

 participation should also be at least **4%**.
- On the available 5 acres of land, we plan to establish a residential senior secondary school along with a teacher training centre.
